

EARLY ADMISSIONS POLICY

An early applicant is defined as a student wishing to enter Central Michigan University after the completion of the junior year of high school.

The program is designed to serve students whose personal and intellectual maturity suggests they are ready for college level work.

Admission Guidelines:

1. If the student is under the age of majority, the student's application must include the permission of the parent or legal guardian.
2. Grade point average of 3.25 on a 4.0 scale in all academic subjects including 9th grade.
3. Recommendation from high school principal or counselor.
4. A score of 24 on the composite portion of the ACT (American College Testing Program) or 560 on the verbal portion of the SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test).
5. Interview by an Admissions Counselor and a person designated by the Academic Admissions, Standards, Honors and Degrees Committee.
6. Unusual cases not within the above guidelines will be reviewed on an individual basis by persons designated by the Academic Admissions, Standards, Honors and Degrees Committee.
